# 1. Welcome & apologies

## 2. Minutes & Matters Arising

- i. No updates on College events. Julia Gosnell will e-mail ECA making it clear which events are limited for security reasons. Wendy Rowland will share how to book at music events to be published in Shout Out.
- ii. "Eton Matters" continues to look for articles by or about children. Thank you to Ben Underwood for his recent article involving his daughters and waterfowl.
- iii. Action: talk to estate agents about new tenants about rubbish collections. RR
- iv. Councillors should soon have heads up on next year's budget. Likely to be bad news.
- v. We should continue to report rubbish issues to our councillors.
- vi. Tivoli are starting the autumn spraying of weeds.
- vii. Good news for the Cockpit which should receive planning approvals within the week. Works likely to start in the New Year. Thank you to Eton Town Council and to our Councillors whose support has made a difference.
- viii. Pharmacy sign Cllr Devon asked for views on a non-flashing sign illuminated during open hours only. Policy for Windsor and Eton is to not have illuminated signs. Eton Town Council do not support illuminated signs. The new sign is interfering with the view of Christmas trees and flags on buildings, which are paid for by businesses and residents. A non-illuminated sign is likely to be allowed, subject to any permissions needed. Consensus from the audience is that it should not be allowed.

- ii. ECA will issue the list of Living Advent Calendar events once known. These are 15-minute slots starting at 18:15 daily from 1<sup>st</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> December in Windsor and Eton.
- iii. 53 High Street is nearly complete. It needs paving stones at the front to be replaced before the hoardings can be removed.
- iv. Next week there will be highways suspensions for waterworks for 53 High Street.
- v. Most lamp posts have peeling paint at dog level. To be investigated further Cllr DD
- vi. Occupancy of buildings is good. Exterior of what was Venture Photography has finally almost finished and the scaffolding has been removed in time for the Lights Switch-on.

- iii. More stalls than ever, in addition to the funfair rides.
- iv. There is a raffle winner will officially switch on the lights.
- v. Road closures 17:00 to 20:00.
- vi. Donations to the Alexander Devine Hospice.
- vii. Sincere thank-you to Kevin Cruise who will be our Compere, Karen Waller, Stephen Gosnell, Ben Willcox and Paul Roach for 6 months of organising and setting this up.

### 6. TVP Update

- i. There will be a police presence tomorrow evening for the light switch on.
- ii. Issues continue with dangerous driving, cyclists delivering food cycling fast the wrong way down the High Street and a beggar who regularly sits on the bridge, who is known to have a home.
- iii. The community needs to record anti-social behaviour so that it can be escalated. It is particularly a problem around 3:00 am at weekends.

- iv. Please do not leave items visible inside cars. There are currently an increased number of break-ins to cars in Windsor. ML has posters which he will take to the Eton Information Centre.
- v. Keep reporting anti-social behaviour via the 101 website or call 101.
