### **6. Chairman's Report**

- i. **Football counters** show that numbers are increasing. This information is published on [etoncommunity.co.uk](http://etoncommunity.co.uk). Highest numbers recently were unsurprisingly on when College celebrated their Fourth of June anniversary.

- ii. **Porny School:** KL and JR are helping pupils to read. KL is going into Eton Porny twice a week and is spending time with two specific children in year One, helping with reading and writing. She will follow them to year 2 in September. (Each visit is necessarily short, owing to their age – anyone interested in joining this rewarding project is welcome to contact KL or the school). LS reports that the school is pleased with the Be Still initiative. A sign was made by ECA, thanks to Paul Bayley and has been erected in an outside area at Porny, for children to enjoy peaceful, reflective time. JR has also helped the pupils with finding gardening resource and a chef will go in from September to help the pupils with cooking.
- iii. **Flagpoles:** RR and Jane Smart are on the case with JS being very helpful in developing the application for permission for additional holders in the High Street. The delay is that new requirements for approval keep getting added by RBWM.
- iv. **College security alarm test:** the College did tell ECA but timing was such that we were unable to pre-inform via Shout Out e-mails.
- v. **“Eton Matters”:** each edition continues to improve. Thanks again to PE and to all those who write articles and who advertise in Eton Matters.

## 8. Social Events

- i. **June: Natural History Museum:** This was a very pleasant evening, George Fussey gave an excellent talk on the building and museum history and on the exhibits. Some exhibits were on display that are not normally on view.
- ii. **July: Summer walk:** meet at Jubilee Square on 30<sup>th</sup> July at 12.15 to walk to the Palmers Arms. People can choose whether to return with the group or separately. ## 9. AOB

- i. **Police Open Day:** 5<sup>th</sup> August at the Police Training Centre at Sulhamstead.

- ii. **"Eton Matters":** not every-one has received their copy. Council clerk Bob Austen and Douglas Hill C.J. Reid both have spare copies. RR apologised for getting Henry Brewis's age wrong; he was 3 and a half at the time of the issue and is now four years old.
- iii. **Cleaning:** Street cleaning is much improved recently with Richard Stone being particularly effective.
- iv. **Toilet sign:** More signs are planned but signs are also needed on the toilet block itself. Inform Eton Town Council again. RR
- v. **Car park:** The bins have now been cleared but the car park is in poor condition with weeds and a damaged fence. Members are chasing council about this. It is unclear when barriers will be finished and whether or not the ticket machines have now been delivered.
- vi. **Area near car park:** builders Ruddy's have a gardener for their properties; Atherton Court gardens are full of weeds. Members and ETC are also following this up.
- vii. **Security and problems in Eton:** There was a long discussion about recent problems; police are saying one thing but then not always following through – examples given included a property break-in, drug-dealing and drug-taking. No-one reported problems with people with the fair but it was noted that the fair may encourage dubious visitors. Eton recently appointed a new head of security who is very experienced and willing to get involved. Police constraints include the number of officers, the time it takes for them to get to Eton and frequent changes to their management and contracts. Neighbourhood Watch was suggested as an option, as was encouraging people to use better padlocks on their bicycles.
