## 5. RBWM Councillor Matters

- i. **LED street lighting** has started, bulkhead lights will be yellow, lamps for the bridge are being made
- ii. **Priority list** has been updated; need to be clear who is doing the work – RR and DB
- iii. **Toilet signs** for Eton Court are ready and should be installed within the week; Brocas signs to be followed up, as per Priority List.
- iv. **Dangerous cycling:** police are routinely monitoring for bad cyclists though some sessions have been cancelled; would be useful to know how often this has happened, how many people have been stopped and how many PCNs issued; discussion around options for signage including making head-down cyclists aware; re-entry sign will be re-painted; discussion about how much we do ourselves versus the risk of reprisals
  - Check whether cycling is allowed on Windsor Bridge RR

- v. **Hostile Vehicle Mitigation Project** in Windsor – project to replace ugly barriers by rising bollards
- vi. **RBWM newspaper** released today
  - Tell MA if you haven't received RBWM newspaper by mid November ALL

- i. **Lights and trees:** lights are being put up and trees will be soon – this year tree lights colour will be white to better match High Street Christmas lights

## 7. Chairman's Report

- i. **Vagrants:** different departments will work together on this; Thames Valley Police have higher priorities of terrorism and serious anti-social behaviour (examples); if you have photos of begging then please e-mail to e-mail [windsorcentralNHPT@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk](mailto:windsorcentralNHPT@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk) or [wardens@rbwm.gov.uk](mailto:wardens@rbwm.gov.uk). One resident reported concern about unaccompanied vagrants bags being used to conceal dangerous items but was told "guards aren't marching today"

- ii. **Crime in Eton:** our crime rate is low within the Thames Valley Police area and tends not to be life threatening; considering to look at CCTV options; gunshop doesn't have its own camera; upgrade of Windsor CCTV cameras is funded (£1.3M); MA mentioned doorbell which records pictures – SE has one and thoroughly recommends it – there is an annual cost though; available from <http://www.robertdyas.co.uk/ring-video-doorbell-satin-nickel> (also available online)
